PRESIDENTS CORNER

The long awaited Spring has finally arrived with Summer hopefully right on it's heels. Summer not only brings warmth, picnics, and some great fly-ins it also brings extreme weather. The time to prepare for that is now.

- Brush up on your knowledge relating to density altitude.
- Check the weather carefully so as not to fly off into thunder storms.
- Review your insurance policy for hurricane and hail protection.
- Make a plan, before you need it, for getting your aircraft out of harms way should a hurricane approach. That plan should include a fellow pilot that can transport the aircraft for you should you be unable to handle transport yourself, in an emergency situation there may be more aircraft needing relocation than available pilots.
- Arrange for temporary hangar space if available.
- If you can't hangar your plane make sure both the tie downs and the anchors are secure. You may want to change out the ropes for something more secure.
- If you have a storage box, on the ramp with your plane, protect you and your neighbor by making sure it can't blow around.
- Police the area around your and your neighbor's aircraft, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.

Remember we are a community, help others and you will reap the benefits.

Center: I'll tell you what -- if you fell out of your airplane right now, you'd never hit the ground



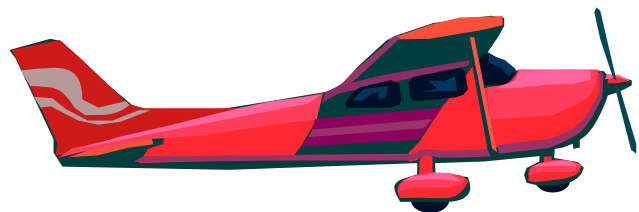
