May 3, 2006 Airport Update

SFZ - RWY 5-23 pavement rehab starting in July. Complete construction should last 90 days with a closure of the RWY for about 30 days. Most of the RWY work will be done at night to limit closures. The RWY width will go from 150 feet to 100 feet to be more in line with FAA standards. The terminal and hangar exteriors will be redone with all new siding and windows.

WST - RWY 7-25 construction is complete along with new TWY's and ramp making the airport virtually new! New MALS have been installed for RWY 7 new REILS for RWY 14-32. 13 obstruction poles are currently being installed with lights on top of each. A vast majority of the airport has been cleared of trees and other obstruction which were penetrating the Part 77 surfaces.

OQU - New hangar /terminal facility is scheduled to start this fall. TWY W is complete and relocated to comply with FAA standards. A new TWY (W-1) connecting the ramp to TWY W has been installed to facilitate our based customers. RWY 5-23 - New PAPI's installed at the approach of both runways and new REILS for RWY 23.

BID - New RWY 10-28 construction to begin in the fall. Again like WST, after the new construction this too will be a new airport. Construction items include new RWY, TWY C to approach of RWY 10, new stubs to ramp, new ramp, new larger terminal, new larger hangar, new access road and new vehicle parking lot. Also turf aircraft parking areas will be marked for the convenience of both based and transient customers. This new construction to the RWY will increase safety areas at each approach. FAA will install new MALS for RWY 10. This is an aggressive project and the island residents are concerned about how it will affect their community with the RWY shutdown for 45 days! I'll keep you posted.

UUU - No new construction at this time however RIAC has plans for RWY 16-34 new construction...design 2008 so probably not until 2009. 9 new lit, obstruction poles have been installed.
