PRESIDENTS CORNER

Welcome back! I hope everyone had a summer filled with as much air-time as weather and fuel costs would allow. General Aviation is facing a challenging time. User fees, fuel costs, training costs, noise and land use issues, and FAA regulation changes have created a stormy environment that can sometime be difficult to navigate.

We as aviators need to be the best that we can be so as not to add fuel to the fires of those who would claim that general aviation is unsafe and that the lands our airports occupy could be put to better use. In the summer of 2008 there were eleven reported accidents/incidents and I'm told that this is an average year.

- 1) 10 May 08 Cessna 182 Substantially damaged after loss of control on landing. Minor injuries. UUU
- 2) 02 June 08 Grumman American damaged after taxiing into a parked a/c. No injuries. BID
- 3) 06 June 08 Twin Comanche, Bonanza substantially damaged after intersection collision. Minor injuries. SFZ
- 4) 08 June 08 Beech C24R experienced sudden stoppage after hitting runway light. No injuries. BID
- 5) 21 June 08 Grumman American damaged after taxiing into a fence post. No injuries. OQU
- 6) 29 June 08 P51D substantially damaged after hard landing. No injuries. PVD
- 7) 03 July 08 Piper Warrior destroyed after impacting trees following Touch & Go. 2 Fatal injuries, 1 serious injury. UUU
- 8) 17 July 08 Balloon experiences hard landing in Jamestown. Minor injury.
- 9) 02 Aug 08 Cessna 182 ditched in the Pawcatuck River after an engine failure. Minor injuries. WST
- 10) 02 Aug 08 Piper Arrow forced to land in a turf farm after experiencing engine problems. No injuries. 08R
- 11) 14 Aug 08 Cessna 172 discovered to have a bent firewall during a 100 hr inspection. No injuries. SFZ

These incidents highlight the need to focus on training, cockpit resource management, maintaining a sterile

cockpit, aircraft maintenance and proper pre-flight procedures.

RIPA will be sponsoring safety seminars this year and I encourage all members to attend. Let's make this year and every year better than average.

OSHKOSH

Airventure is an exciting event indeed. I departed with some friends in N9465X on Thur morning headed to the 1st planned stop, Buffalo. Weather was initially fine, but we ran into thunderstorms near our destination and ATC suggested we divert to Warsaw, NY. After refueling and lunch we proceeded on our 2nd leg, to Mt. Pleasant, MI. Weather was good again, except for the Buffalo area where it was just light rain. We arrived at Mt. Pleasant around 5 PM and refueled. Decided to stay overnight in a motel nearby, out of fear that OSH tie-downs may be full or the field closed during the airshow, and did not want to divert to another airport. We figured, Arriving there around 7 AM, when airport opens for inbound traffic, guarantees space [because outbound traffic starts at 6, an hour earlier].

We took off 6:15 AM EDT [=5:15 AM in OSH, Central time] next day [Fri], in beautiful weather, and proceeded to cross the lake. After doing the ritual pattern via Ripon & Fiske, we had an eventless landing Rwy27, at 7:20 AM. Seeing from the air those thousands of aircraft parked on the ground is a unique view indeed.

Stayed with some friends at the Univ. of Wis. dorms which are about a mile away from the grounds, an easy commute with the city shuttle buses.

Enjoyed much the airshows [which I religiously attended every day], as well as the lectures I chose. Visited the seaplane base 1 morning. Also, we stayed 1 night for the "Theater in the Woods" show, to watch a John Travolta [aviation related] movie [Broken Arrow], introduced live by Captain Travolta himself. A nice man indeed.

Departing back on Sunday, 9:30 AM, we had an eventless flight with good weather, except a few isolated thunderstorms here in N. England.
