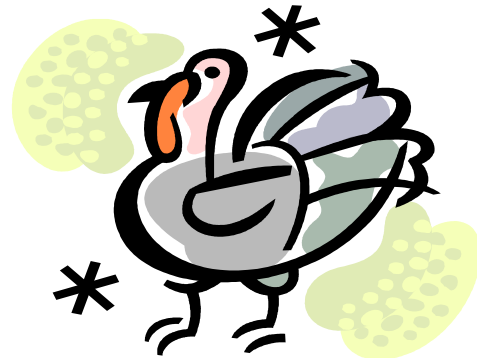
The meeting was adjourned at 8:00pm
