Weekend Flying

Welcome back and I hope everyone had a good Thanksgiving holiday as I did. The SFZ "Fly to Lunch Bunch" is still active and well. We have been meeting Saturdays and Sundays whenever the weather Gods are kind to us. Last Saturday, the 21st, a few of us met at Gene Collette's Restaurant at FIT for a bite to eat and of course a destination to fly to.

That day I was introduced to Light Sport flying. I rode along with Gabe in his Light Sport CT as we ventured out to Fitchburg. It was a nice VFR day with light winds and great visibility. The ride was comfortable and it gave me a chance to get acquainted with this little airplane. For the trip back to SFZ, Gabe was gracious enough to let me fly it home. I was trilled to have that opportunity and didn't hesitate to take the controls. This little plane performs better than expected. It gets off the ground in short order and climbs with the best of the fleet burning only 6 GPH. Cleans up and cruises at an indicated 120 knots using only 4.5 GPH. The noise level in the cockpit is quieter than most and the engine is very smooth. The controls are a bit heavy, probably due to the spring loaded centering but that wasn't a problem. Approach to land is a very slow 54 knots which allows for a rather short landing. The alignment picture during the flair to land was the most difficult, probably because of the extremely short nose. This would take a little time to get use too. All in all, the CT was a fun plane to fly, handles well and it has very respectable numbers.

RIPA 2009 Airman of the Year Thomas J. Magnan

Thomas J. Magnan has been selected as the 2009 RIPA Airman of the Year. Mr. Magnan recently retired as Commander of Detachment 23 Operational Support Airlift

of the Rhode Island Army National Guard. Through his extensive career, he has flown over 20,000 flight hours in more than 50 different aircraft, holds several type ratings and is a dual-rated instructor and ATP aviator in both helicopters and fixed-wing aircraft.

He started his aviation career as a helicopter pilot, and flew 704 combat hours in Viet Nam (1969-70). In 1973, Tom's friend and colleague Joe Ludovici introduced him to his dad Sabbie Ludovici, who taught him to fly airplanes and perform aerobatics. Tom became a CFII for single- and multi-engine airplanes and helicopters, as well as an aerobatic instructor. Tom remained with the RI Army National Guard as an Aviation Maintenance Officer through 1979.

From 1979-82, Tom was a test pilot at MIT/Lincoln Labs where he was an engineering flight test coordinator and chief pilot for the rotary wing section, and lead test pilot for several fixed wing projects. In 1982, Mr. Magnan returned full time to the RI Army National Guard, this time as a senior instructor pilot and instrument flight examiner for both fixed and rotary wing aircraft. He was responsible to the commander for the oversight and management of all aviators assigned to the RIARNG to include the completion of all annual training requirements and the conduct of all new equipment training.

From Oct 2005 – Nov 06 Mr Magnan was assigned to active duty as a C-23 pilot with Company D, 1st Batallion, 126th Aviation regiment, stationed in Balad AB Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. In Oct 2008 – 09 he served a second tour of duty, in support of both Iraqi Freedom and Edduring Freedom, this time stationed in Ali Al Salem, Kuwait, where he provided transportation to flag officers and senior executives from the DoD with annual flying program in excess of 2000 hours. His aviation duties took him extensively throughout Southwest Asia, North, South and Central America and the Caribbean. Tom retired from the Rhode Island Army National Guard at Age 60 as a Chief Warrant Officer 5 (CW5) in June 2009, and is currently a self-employed aviation consultant.
